

It takes me back to January 2000 when I had visited as a guest faculty to teach International Finance. He was present in my class and that was my first meeting with him. After the class, he had a few words of encouragement and a genuine expression of a smile on his face. By the end of the course, I joined as a full-time faculty member at IMIS which was then situated at Vivekanda Marg, Bhubaneswar.

He was an astute administrator. Nevertheless, he was compassionate, kind, and merciful. As a person, he always believed in giving. He was the one who reached the earliest to the institute and was the last to leave. His passion to create a world-class organisation always made him look for people who were passionate to work for the institute and could fulfil his vision of making IMIS the most talked about academic institution among corporate, students, researchers and faculty members. He and our advisor sir Dr K K Beuria worked tirelessly to bring IMIS to its present status.

DG sir would make you comfortable while working and give you the confidence to work. As a young faculty member, he helped me design a stock market game for Management Odyssey 2001 a National level inter B-School meet. He

motivated the entire faculty team to fulfil academic achievements and integrate those with institutional goals. He gave energy, commitment and inspiration to his staff and to others with whom he worked. All the employees working under him were always willing to go that extra mile for the organisation and work for longer years.

He had a brilliant knowledge of the stock markets and was a genius when it came to investments. He not only invested but also trained the students from his practical experience. He had also helped me learn and master a lot of concepts on the stock markets. His dream was to see his students at very senior positions in companies for which he left no stone unturned for their development. He encouraged faculty members to bring the latest practices to the classes through cases or invite practitioners and trainers to share their experiences to expose students to the latest industrial practices. In this regard, in the early days, Saturdays were converted into a Business Session Day where there would be a developmental session, followed by an interaction with an industry practitioner and finally ending with some event with prizes, throughout the year. For his focus on an industry-academic interface, a lot of big corporate leaders visited the campus on various occasions.

He practised the three pillars of IMIS i.e. discipline, leadership and commitment. He worked for very long hours to achieve the vision he had set for IMIS. He had a participative leadership style which helped him achieve high productivity levels from his employees. He would delegate work considering the strengths of each person. In any programme of the institute or even the family functions of the employees, he was among the earliest to reach and last to leave. He along with our advisor sir was present in all activities like the welcome ceremony, farewell function, Diwali, New Year celebrations, conferences etc.

Besides being an able administrator, head of the institution and stock market genius he had a penchant for cooking. In staff picnics, he would himself contribute to the process of cooking. His involvement and merrymaking with everybody would make all feel he was just like one of us.

He always said that IMIS would never bid farewell to anybody, rather it made everybody a part of their family. At this hour he is no more physically present with us but his virtues, his deeds would be eternal. Today I certainly miss him a lot. It would be impossible to fill the vacuum he has left behind. But his insistence to work with commitment will keep on inspiring us.
